Makawao - Hui Noʻeau Visual Arts Center and East Maui Watershed Partnership present the 12<sup>th</sup> annual Mālama Wao Akua, a fine art exhibition that creatively merges the worlds of art and conservation with works of art that honor Maui Nui's native plant and animal species. This highly anticipated exhibition is on display in the gallery at Hui Noʻeau Visual Arts Center from September 9<sup>th</sup> – November 30<sup>th</sup>. Jurors representing a blend of art and science for Mālama Wao Akua are Pat Bily and Melissa Chimera. Aloha Recycling and Pacific Biodiesel generously sponsor this year's exhibition. Throughout the exhibition, Hui Noʻeau and East Maui Watershed Partnership will engage the community with a collection of accompanying educational opportunities. "Talk Story" Thursdays will take place at the Hui throughout the exhibition featuring different industry leaders from the field of conservation. Hui Noʻeau invites Maui artists working in any medium to create work depicting only species native to Maui Nui (Maui, Lanaʻi, Molokaʻi, Kahoʻolawe), a landscape showcasing only native Maui Nui species, or people working to protect Maui's native species and native habitats. Mālama Wao Akua is a juried fine art exhibition with entry categories open to adults as well as elementary, middle & high school students residing in Maui Nui. Entries must be submitted in person (no photos) at Hui Noʻeau on August 30<sup>th</sup> from 9am-6pm to be eligible for exhibition. Artists may submit up to three entries in any medium. Adults: For Hui members, the non-refundable entry fee is \$10 per piece. For non-members, the non-refundable entry fee is \$20 per piece. For youth the non-refundable entry fee is \$5 per piece. Hui No'eau is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit, community-based, visual arts education organization offering open access to quality visual arts instruction by professional teaching artists and free arts opportunities through exhibitions, lecture series and more. Founded in 1934, the mission of Hui No'eau Visual Arts Center is to unlock creativity through exceptional visual arts education and enhance this endeavor through the preservation of the historic Kaluanui estate. The Hui will celebrate 100 years of Kaluanui in 2017. The Hui is open to the public daily from 9am-4pm with free admission.

Celebrating its 25<sup>th</sup> year, the East Maui Watershed Partnership is committed to protecting our islands fresh water source and native rainforest health. The 100,000 acre East Maui watershed produces over 60 billion gallons of water a year and is home to many rare and endangered species. These watersheds represent our source of water, culture, and biodiversity. From the original idea that stared in 1991, there are now 10 similar partnerships across the State of Hawai'i.
