Denby Freeland

Born and raised on Oʻahu and currently residing on Maui, Denby's recent works are a collection of watercolors, mixed media paintings, and kapa, which capture the light, shadow, and rhythm of Hawaiʻi's plants. Her family history dates back many generations in Hawaiʻi, yet Denby has developed a unique style all her own to share her vision of Hawaiʻi. She graduated from Punahou School on Oʻahu, earned a Bachelor's degree at the University of Washington, and her Masters degree in Education at Heritage College, Washington.

Lufi Luteru is kupa'aina from Makaha Valley, O'ahu. She is a diversified entrepreneur and a kanaka maoli weaver and jewelry designer who shares her visual philosophies, education, and ancestral stories through creations of Hawaiian fiber art, custom-made jewelry, and wearable art. Lufi earned her BA and MA at the Kamakakūokalani Center for Hawaiian Studies at the University of Hawaiiat at Manoa where she has also taught as a lecturer. Lufi has annually participated in the MAMo Native Hawaiian Art events including the Art Markets and Wearable Arts Fashion Shows since their beginning in 2006.
